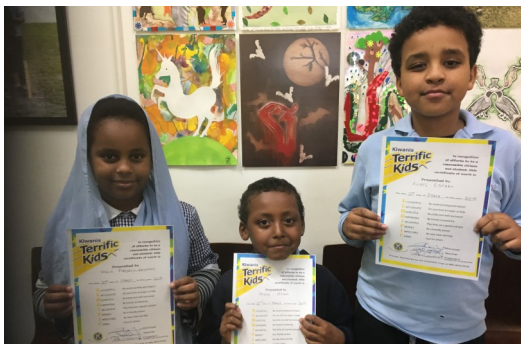

## Hot Chocolate Club

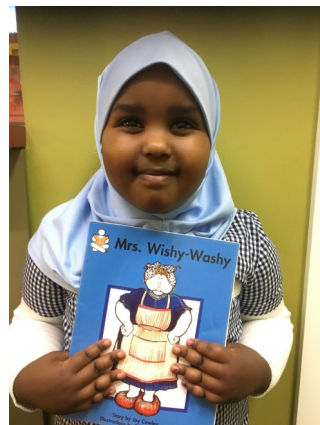

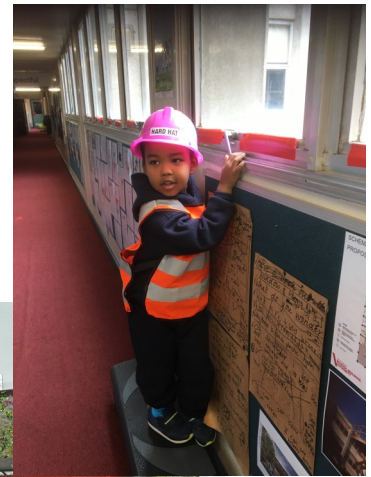
