Talking with Teachers

Teachers have now spent many weeks throughout this term working on individual student reports which will be sent home in a few weeks. Parent meetings with teachers will then take place on either Monday June 18th (4/5/6 Steph) or Wednesday June 20th between 2pm –7pm. These will be normal school days for children. We look forward to seeing all families attending these important meetings. Please come at your allocated time to ensure the smooth running of the afternoons. Interpreters will be available for those parents who need one.

At Carlton Primary we have three way conferences, which means that your child will be at the meeting, discussing their learning progress so far this year and sharing with you examples of their work.

Three way conferences are common in most primary schools. By being part of this important discussion, children begin to understand their role in the learning process. As well as this, parents/carers get to see evidence, not only of what their child is learning, but of the type of learner their child is and how they interact with their teachers.

Hot Chocolate Club

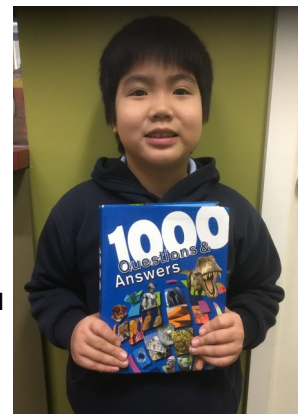

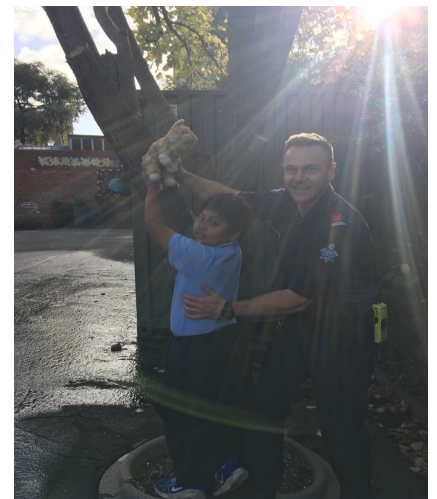
What's happening with the learning precinct redevelopment?
