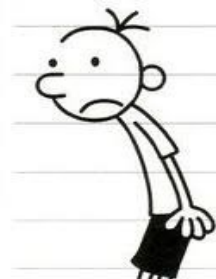
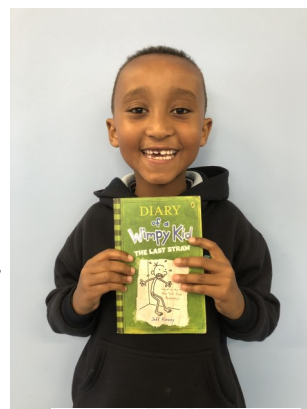

We have had two sessions so far and will have two more visits to the gardens before the end of term. We worked with an educator at the RBG and investigated indigenous plants and creatures we find in the garden. In addition, students made creations using natural resources (cubbies, boats and Mandela's) and explored how to care for our gardens. We plan to bring what we have seen and learnt about outdoor learning spaces back to Carlton Primary and use it to create our own outdoor play space in our school!
