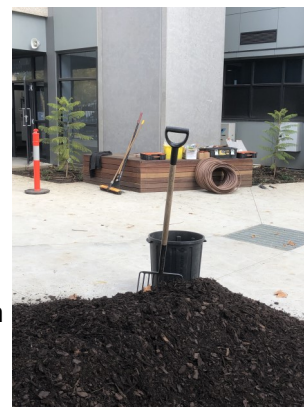

 - Plastering and plumbing has started

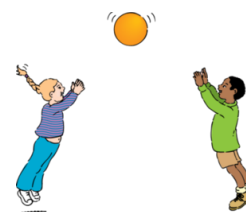


Staff are having a site tour this week to look at the progress on level one and to start planning for the move of administration and the P/1 learning area back down to level one next term.
