I asked the students to cut multiple circles of different sizes and colours. Then they were asked to arrange them in concentric circles and to imagine they were the leaves on the trees.

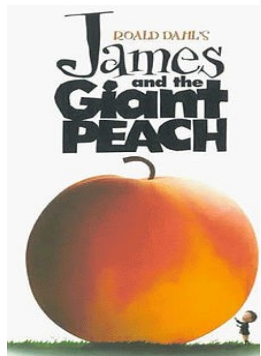
