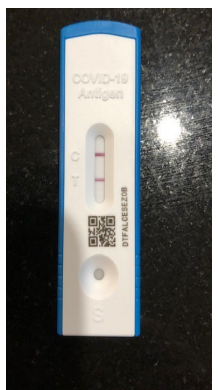
Wear What You Want Day
