Supervision

Families are reminded that teachers are on duty before school from 8.45-9.00am and after school from 3.15 until 3.30pm. Children should not be unattended in the school grounds before or after these times.

Swimming Program

The Education Dept of Victoria includes swimming and water safety as an important part of the Health & Physical Education Curriculum. At Carlton Primary School we offer our students an intensive swimming program towards the end of every school year. Classes are conducted by qualified YMCA staff. The swimming program is compulsory for all students, permission notes will come home this week and need to be signed and returned to your child's teacher. Usually the cost of our program is heavily subsidised. This year we are able to cover 100% of the cost to families from grants received by the school. The program starts on Monday Dec 5th and will run every afternoon until Friday December 16th. If you have any questions about the program please see class teachers. Parents of children in the younger years are asked to help their children be prepared for the swimming program by practising getting dressed and undressed on their own. This is what will be expected of children at the pool. All children are encouraged to wear their bathers to school under their uniform. If you would like your child to wear goggles during their swimming lessons and do not already have some, you can buy them from the Carlton Baths before swimming starts.

Swimmers will need to bring:

- a towel
- underwear
- bathers
- a bag



An important note:-

Parents are very welcome to be at the pool to watch sessions, however due to child safety regulations, Parents and carers are not permitted in the change rooms at any time.

Congratulations to Abdulahi from grade 2 who was the lucky winner of the grade 6 fund raiser. He guessed 199 lollies in the jar!






How often do you pick/use plants from the CLP gardens?

38 responses




Were you aware before today that there are herbs and other plants growing for the CLP community to pick and use?

Due to popular request we have recently planted lettuce, silverbeet, Vietnamese mint, Lebanese cress, rue (also known as *Tenadum/ Talatam*) coriander, sage, thyme and heaps of strawberries.
