

Referendum outcome

On Saturday October the 14th, a nationwide referendum was held. The referendum asked to change the constitution to include Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islander people being able to have a voice on matters relating to their lives.

Along with many others, I voted yes in the referendum, because I believe that this small change to our constitution, would be an important step in the right direction on our reconciliation journey. Unfortunately, the majority of people across Australia didn't agree with me and the referendum failed. Like lots of people here at Carlton Primary School and in the wider community, I was sorry and sad that the yes vote didn't win.

However, as I explained at assembly last week, here at Carlton Primary School we will continue to acknowledge the ongoing impact of colonisation on First Nations people and we will be honest about this in all of our teaching. Within our curriculum, we will continue to celebrate the strength, pride and resilience of Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islander people, the longest living culture in the world.

I reminded our students that they are lucky to be the first generation of non indigenous young people that will have their whole education being taught indigenous perspectives & having truth telling as an embedded part of their learning.

I assured them, many of whom were upset and confused by the referendum result, that because they are growing up at a time when the truth about indigenous history is now being told, that I had absolutely no doubt that when it comes to their turn to vote on important issues like this in the future, that they will do so with accurate information, with compassion and with kindness.




