Families are reminded that teachers are on duty before school from 8.45-9.00am and after school from 3.15 until 3.30pm. Children should not be unattended in the school grounds before or after these times.

New medical clinic in Carlton

I've been asked to share with families details of a new **Medical and Urgent Care Clinic** that has recently opened in Carlton at 1/221 Drummond Street. The clinic is open Monday—Saturday from 8am-10pm and bulk bills. Families who have used it say that the service there has been excellent and it's a good alternative to waiting for long periods at the Royal Children's Hospital. Injuries and illnesses that receive priority care at the clinic are cuts & lacerations, basic fractures and sprains, minor burns, urinary tract infections, respiratory conditions like asthma and ENT infections.

School times

We have had a great start to the year with most students being at school by 9am. Well done! Thank you to all of those parents/carers who ensure that their children arrive at school on time every morning.



Children who arrive later than 9am are missing out on important learning. If children are away from school for any reason please let the school know. This can be through a phone message, a written note or by coming to the office in person. We ask that adults, rather than siblings, are informing us about any absences.

Education Department guidelines instruct schools to contact parents/carers on the day that a student is absent if schools have not been given a reason for that absence. This will be done via a text message generated if your child is marked absent at the start of the school day and we have not been informed of a reason for that absence.
