IDAHOBIT Day—Promoting kindness and respect

As part of our ongoing acknowledgement and celebration of important dates which celebrate our vibrant and diverse community, IDAHOBIT day is on May 17. This is a day acknowledged internationally to educate against LGBTIQ+ discrimination. We recognise that LGBTIQ+ people and children are within all communities and cultures, including our school. Data shows that 2 out of 3 LGBTIQ+ youth experience discrimination due to their identity. Globally, there is increasing discrimination and violence directed at LGBTIQ+ people. At Carlton Primary School, and across the Learning Precinct, we embody kindness and respect for all. It is important for all students and staff to feel included and have a supportive learning and working environment. Schools are places where many diverse people come together. We have people with different religious beliefs, different cultural backgrounds and different sexual and gender identities. Here at CPS we know that when members of our school and community understand and respect one another, that everybody benefits. Part of learning for students is to see and appreciate the diversity that exists in their classroom, their school, and the wider community. While IDAHOBIT is just one day in the calendar, at Carlton PS we promote religious, cultural and LGBTIQ+ inclusion all year round. Our values at Carlton Primary School include respect and diversity. We pride ourselves on being a school where every person can be free to be who they are, and to feel safe, supported and respected. Please talk to your children about this important message.

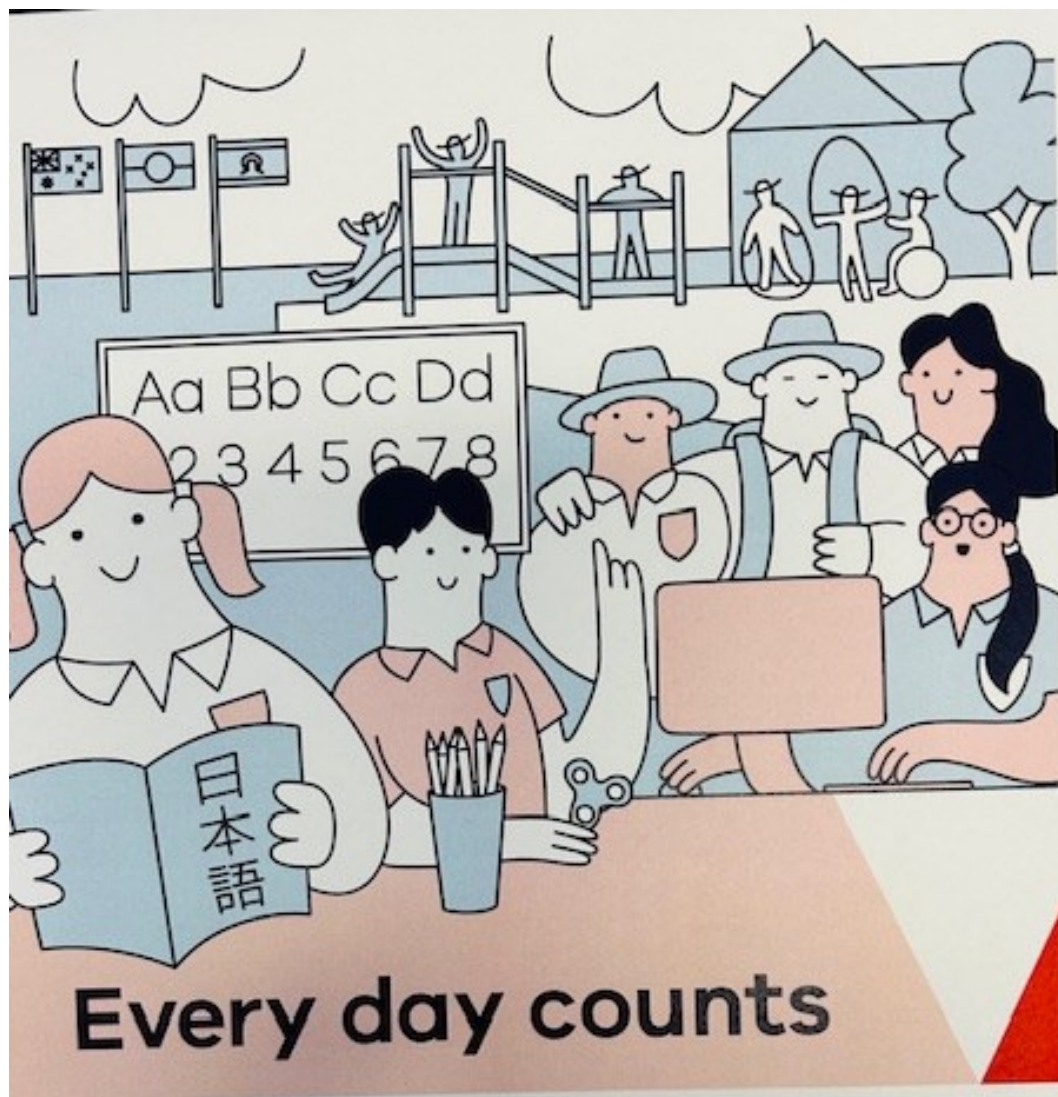
